ALGAE EATERS

CHARACTERISTICS: These fish are typically good community fish. However, they should not be put with any slow moving fish because the algae eaters will "scrub" them. They do have a tendency to become aggressive toward with one another as they age.

TEMPERATURE: These fish prefer temperatures at 75-82 degrees. Use aquarium heaters to maintain tank temperatures to proper water climate, which contributes to the health of the fish, reduces stress levels, and makes them less susceptible to oxygen shortages. Make sure the fish's water temperature requirements are compatible with those of its tank mates.

SUBSTRATE: Gravel, rock or wood are used to cover the floor of the aquarium tank. In addition to enhancing the appearance of the tank, substrates can act as a bed for biological filtration systems, anchor for aquatic plants, and provide a "burrowing" place for some fish species. Do not use coral sand, coral shells, or oolite in freshwater tanks. Clean substrate material and other tank decorations thoroughly in tap water (no soap) until water "runs clear" before adding it to the tank.

LIGHT: Fish don't do well when exposed to natural light in temperate regions where the length of a day varies. It is best to duplicate a fish's tropical environment by providing 12 hours of controlled lighting daily. A good rule of thumb is to provide 2 watts of lamp power for every gallon of tank water.

DECORATIONS: Tanks that have plenty of "refuge" places for each of these fish.

WATER QUALITY: Most species are not very demanding as far as water conditions. A pH value between 6.0-8.0 is ideal in soft to hard water. Replacement of 20-25% of water is recommended every month in a freshwater tank. Make sure water being added to the tank is the same pH as the tank water, since imbalance can affect the health of the fish. Algae occur naturally in all aquatic ecosystems, but excessive algae growth can give an aquarium an unattractive appearance and upset water quality.

DIET: Packaged foods are the way to ensure fish receive a proper balanced diet. Foods come in different forms to satisfy different kinds of eaters. These fish are best fed slow sinking pellets since they are low-level dwellers. They also feed on the algae and other material in your tank. As a rule, fish should never be fed more food than they can consume in five minutes. Over-feeding fish is one of the most common mistakes and a major contributor to tank problems.
