MINI LOP RABBIT

Oryctolagus coniculus

ORIGIN: Mini Lop rabbits were first bred in England. Your rabbit was born in captivity in the USA. Mini lop rabbits are a relatively new breed, and the term "Lop" stems from the characteristic ears of this rabbit which are extremely long and wide and hang to either side of the head, touching the ground. Most Mini Lops are considered a large breed rabbit. Rabbits make great pets because of their curiosity, sociability and they rarely bite unless provoked. Most rabbits can be taught to jump over little hurdles or stand up on command with a little training.

LIFESPAN: 7-8 years

GESTATION: 31-33 days. It is recommended that spay/neutering your rabbit will calm their overall behavior.

SIZE: Mini Lop rabbits are the largest breed, weighing 10-12 lbs.

CAGING: Mini Lop rabbits will thrive in a variety of commercially available cages with the following basic requirements: solid flooring (not wire), secure lid, protection from heat, cold, and drafts, and hiding area. A cage with 2 1/2 square feet of floor space is large enough for one mini lop rabbit. For each additional rabbit that is kept, the cage should be 1 square foot larger. Most rabbits may be successfully kept outdoors provided they have protection from extreme temperatures and are acclimated.

SUBSTRATE: Mini Lop rabbits can be successfully kept on a variety of substrates including pine shavings, pelleted and processed bedding. Most rabbits can be successfully litter trained by putting the litter box in the same corner your rabbit has already soiled in.

TEMPERATURE: Mini lop rabbits prefer temperatures between 47°F and 64°F. However, they will tolerate temperatures up to 84°F before there is a risk for heat exhaustion. The cage should be placed in a location that is free from drafts and direct sunlight.

DIET: Mini Lop rabbits will thrive on a variety of available pelleted foods which should form the foundation of their diet in addition to a constant supply of timothy hay. The diet can be also be supplemented with fresh fruits and vegetables, especially dark leafy greens. A mineral block should also be hung in the rabbit's cage. Some of a rabbits favorite treats are: parsley, carrots with tops, a slice of any fruit. Do not give your rabbit these items because they can cause gas: cabbage, broccoli, cauliflower or any lettuce. Young rabbits have a very sensitive stomach; therefore a strict diet must be followed. Upset in their diet can cause dehydration from excessive diarrhea. It is important that chew items are available so that the teeth are kept worn down. All rabbits must have access to fresh, clean drinking water at all times. A sipper bottle is preferable to a water bowl because it is typically cleaner and easier to maintain.
